

## QUICK START GUIDE: CUSTOM REMAINDER RULES

EZID users may choose to create custom remainders for their identifiers. To ensure that the custom remainders are well-formed and do not generate errors, please follow the rules below.

## For ARKs

| Property             | Description   |
|----------------------|---|
| Permitted Characters | A-Z   |
|                      | a-z   |
|                      | 0-9   |
|                      | = (equal)   |
|                      | ~ (tilde)   |
|                      | * (asterisk)  |
|                      | + (plus)  |
|                      | @ (at)  |
|                      | _ (underscore)  |
|                      | \$ (dollar)   |
| Other Permitted      | % (percent)   |
| Characters, but with | - (hyphen)  |
| Reserved Meanings    | . (point)   |
|                      | / (slash)   |
| Case-Sensitive?      | Yes. For example, 12345/aBc and 12345/abc are different ARKs. |

## For DOIs

| Property             | Description  |
|----------------------|--|
| Permitted Characters | A-Z  |
|                      | a-z  |
|                      | 0-9  |
|                      | : (colon)  |
|                      | . (point)  |
|                      | - (hyphen)   |
|                      | _ (underscore)   |
|                      | / (slash)  |
|                      | Special characters and symbols (i.e. umlauts, @, \$, &, etc.) are not allowed.   |
| Case-Sensitive?      | No. For example, 10.5517/CCPMZKT and 10.5517/ccpmzkt are the same DOI. Note that the DataCite server automatically saves |
|                      | identifiers in upper case letters and they are displayed accordingly in the metadata search.                             |
